
INDEX OF MEDICINAL PLANTS ACCORDING TO PRINCIPAL USES



This index classifies by their uses medicinal plants appearing in Chapter 5: Materia Medica. Many plants listed below are used in combination ("blends") in addition to being used alone ("simples"). Most bush medicine practitioners consider certain plants to be effective only when used in a blend, often involving an odd-numbered combination of plants. For further information on blends see Chapter 3: Principles and Practices of Bush Medicine.
